Charles Darwin University introduced a Bachelor of Pharmacy course in 2006, building on a very successful first year feeder program that has been running for 6 years. The Bachelor of Pharmacy course is located within the School of Science and Primary Industries, which delivers range courses in environmental science and allied health.

There are currently four pharmacy-dedicated academic staff members and the course is also supported by high quality teaching staff in the basic science areas.

The University has close links with Royal Darwin Hospital which provides teaching services to the undergraduate pharmacy degree programme and is developing joint practice research projects.

Charles Darwin University is looking to recruit an energetic, motivated and qualified person with expertise in pharmacotherapeutics, clinical pharmacy, pharmacy practice or applied pharmacology to join its pharmacy team. The role of the Lecturer / Senior Lecturer in Pharmacy will be to take responsibility for the delivery of units, particularly in the area of pharmaco-therapeutics, within the University's Bachelor of Pharmacy degree, engage in research, and contribute to a vibrant and productive pharmacy team. A willingness to work collaboratively in teaching and research with colleagues from the Royal Darwin Hospital, The Graduate School of Health Practice, The School of Health Science, and the Menzies School of Health Research and interact with the profession is an important aspect of the position.

Applications would be welcomed from hospital pharmacists with extensive clinical experience and, preferably, a postgraduate qualification in clinical pharmacy and who are interested in an academic career.

The following examples of accountabilities are not exhaustive and may include others as directed from time to time.

- Contribute to the development of the pharmacy curriculum.
- Prepare and deliver units leading to the Bachelor of Pharmacy, including lectures, tutorials and workshops where appropriate.
- To provide units or lectures to other degree courses within the University, as appropriate.
- To be a constructive and active member of the pharmacy program team.
- Undertake or participate in appropriate professional activities.
- Undertake research and supervision of postgraduate research students within their area of expertise.
- Participate in appropriate university committees and panels.
- Carry out administrative and other duties as directed by the Head of School.
- Liaise with community pharmacists and clinical pharmacists at the Royal Darwin Hospital and other health care providers to develop links between the University and the profession
- Liaise with Government and private health care providers, to develop research and training initiatives relevant to remote communities and clinical placements.

6. Demonstrate awareness of current methods and developments in the research sector of your discipline and provide evidence of a research profile by evidence of publications.
7. Demonstrated ability to develop and promote relationships with external stakeholders including industry, government agencies and professional bodies.

The NT government has a labour agreement with the department of immigration and multicultural affairs to offer both temporary and permanent residency sponsorship for overseas-trained pharmacists fulfilling the APEC criteria
